Efflorescence is a chalky like substance of salts and other water dispersible materials that can visibly form at the surface when water or moisture are present in or on brick, concrete, stone, stucco, grout and any other building surfaces. It has a white or grayish tint and consists of salt deposits left behind when water evaporates. Low temperatures, moist conditions, condensation, rain and dew induce efflorescence. It is often a seasonal problem, and humidity will impact whether efflorescence will occur. It usually escalates in winter, since rain, snow, sleet and other inclement weather conditions may arise. However, efflorescence can still occur in spring, fall and summer.
